BACKGROUND

PROJECT EXPERIENCE

Project Manager / Acquisition & Relocation Specialist – Pinewood Heights Redevelopment Project Town of Smithfield, VA.

This CDBG-funded project focused on the voluntary acquisition and relocation of thirty-two (32) households located throughout the neighborhood. Relocation activities were executed in order to provide decent, safe and affordable housing in a suitable living environment for the residents of the neighborhood.

Assistant Project Manager / Market Analyst – Housing Development Blueprint Brunswick County, VA, Industrial Development Authority.

After performing an analysis of the real estate market data for the County and surrounding communities, field surveys of the County and relevant markets in the region were conducted. Input was sought from real estate concerns active in the County to identify successful models and determine potential areas of opportunity. Three development scenarios and site plans were created that build on existing or planned community assets (water & sewer in the County's small towns, numerous small ponds and lakes, and the development of new trails). The final report included all of the background data, the site plans for potential new development, implementation strategies, and a timetable.

Project Manager – Comprehensive Plan Update Emporia and Irvington, VA.

Working closely with the Planning Commission, existing conditions were analyzed, potentials for development identified, and recommendations developed for the future. The plan also served to maintain the area's high quality of life through a series of goals and objectives along with implementation strategies.
